DAY 1

Sun 12 March

21:35 Depart from Sydney by All Nippon Airways' overnight flight NH880

TOKYO - NOTO

[light lunch, Welcome Dinner]

DAY 2

Mon 13 March

05:10 Arrive in Tokyo. After clearing quarantine and customs check-in for your connecting flight to Noto, Flight no. NH747 dep. Haneda at 08:55, arr. Noto at 09:50. Travel to Noto Peninsula by chartered coach.

Enjoy famous Wajima morning market bustling with locals doing their grocery shopping for freshly caught fish, local fruit and vegetables, and various dried goods as well as locally produced Wajima lacquerware. The market dates back over 1,000 years and draws everyday shoppers and curious visitors as well.

We will also visit Yatai Kaikan to see four festival floats which form part of the autumn Takayama festival's eleven floats (yatai). These elaborately decorated floats, up to 8 meters tall, are several hundred years old and are beautiful examples of Takayama's legendary craftsmanship.

We stay at onsen resort, welcome dinner at hotel. Enjoy experiencing the Japanese life style in a tatami room, enjoy a dip in a hot spring and sleep on futon bedding.

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NOTO – KANAZAWA

DAY 3

Tue 14 MARCH

This morning we travel to Kanazawa visiting Kanazawa's famous Ohmi fish market and having lunch at Café & Brasserie Paul Bocuse.

After lunch we step back in time with a visit to Kanazawa's beautifully preserved historic Chaya Gai Geisha district with its many traditional wooden buildings. This area was established in 1820 as an entertainment district for rich merchants and nobility.

We move on to Kenrokuen Gardens, one of the top three landscaped gardens in Japan. It derives its fame and its name from its beautiful landscaping which embodies the six key principles of Japanese garden design.

After a stroll through Kenrokuen, we check in late afternoon at our hotel for 1 night.

KANAZAWA – OSAKA

Wed 15 MARCH

Morning at leisure.

At 10:45 we transfer to Kanazawa station.

This morning we travel for Osaka by train along Lake Biwa, the largest lake in Japan.

Enjoy the scenery of rural Japan as you speed past rice paddies, farms, lakes and forests. Upon arrival in Osaka we will be transferred by chartered coach to our hotel. Check in for 2 nights.

This evening we enjoy dinner at a local restaurant.

Thu 16 MARCH

Today we set out for some Osaka sightseeing, visiting Osaka Castle and Kuromon Ichiba, a lively covered market stretching for 580 meters in Osaka's Chuo Ward. Nicknamed "Osaka's kitchen" because both local homeowners and restaurant chefs get their supplies here, the market is famous for its fresh seafood and has over recent years become a popular tourist destination.

So too is Doguya suji, nicknamed "Kitchenware street" by locals, a 150 meter arcade where you can find everything from ceramics, lacquerware, super sharp kitchen knives, and sturdy pots and pans to restaurant supplies like plastic replica food, large paper lanterns, noren split curtains, maneki neko beckoning cats and all kinds of restaurant signage.

Dinner tonight is a buffet at the hotel.

OSAKA- NAOSHIMA ART ISLAND

DAY 6

Fri 17 MARCH

Catch a bullet train to Okayama and catch a ferry to travel to the world renowned art Island of Naoshima in Japan's Inland Sea. Blessed with nature and attracting worldwide attention for its many contemporary art museums, Naoshima was selected by sightseeing magazine Conde Naste as one of the "seven places in the world you should see next."

We visit the inspiring Chichu museum, both a museum and a work of art in its own right. Check in at Benesse House Naoshima for 1 night.

Dinner at the Michelin awarded Terrace restaurant at Benesse house.

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NAOSHIMA – TAKAMATSU – KYOTO

Sat 18 MARCH

Morning, we catch an Inland Sea Ferry to Takamatsu, and visit Ritsurin Park which is the largest “National Special Scenic Beauty Garden” in Japan. Made up of 6 ponds and 13 hills beautifully arranged against the green pine trees of the surrounding hills and many stone arrangements the garden evokes the wonderful style of the early Edo era.

Enjoy a famous “Sanuki Udon” noodle for lunch in Kaiseki style at Gou Yashiki. We then travel on to Kyoto. Upon arrival at Kyoto catch a subway for a few minutes to Shijo station and check in to our hotel for 3 nights. Accommodation: Karasuma Kyoto Hotel or similar

KYOTO

DAY 8

Sun 19 MARCH

Kyoto is the spiritual heart of Japan and is home to many UNESCO World Heritage Sites. It was the main centre for the evolution of religious and secular architecture and of garden design for almost a thousand years.

During our stay in Kyoto we will get to experience this first hand beginning today with a morning sightseeing tour visiting two of its most famous UNESCO world heritage sites, the Golden Pavilion (Kinkakuji) and Zuihou-in Zen temple & Zuihouin rock garden.

Kinkakuji is a beautiful Zen temple whose top two stories are completely covered in gold leaf. After a morning of healthy exercise exploring temples and gardens, we will enjoy a Teppanyaki lunch at Tokiwa.



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Afternoon, we visit Fushimi Inari famous for its thousands of vermillion torii gates forming dazzling tunnels as they wend their way up the mountainside. Our next stop is a visit to the quaint 400 year old historic district of Higashiyama and the elegant and impressive Kiyomizu temple.

Transfer back to Karasuma Kyoto hotel. Evening is at leisure. Accommodation: Karasuma Kyoto Hotel or similar

Tue 21 MARCH

This morning we travel to Kiso Valley, with its quaint historical post towns. Kiso Valley is surrounded by Japan's foremost high mountains, the Ontake mountain range on



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the west and the Central Alps in the east. Prior to the Edo period, Kiso prospered as a key junction for transportation and as a production area of Japanese cypress, the main building material for shrines and temples.

We visit the post town of Tsumago, seldom visited by group tours, where cars are banned and signs of modernity such as power lines are hidden to maintain the old-style ambience.

After taking some time to soak up the ambiance of real village Japan as we stroll through the narrow streets, we travel on to Tokyo travelling by bullet train. Upon arrival at Tokyo station, catch a local train one stop to Yurakucho/Ginza, the closest station to our hotel.

We end our trip with a stay in a 5 star hotel, checking in at The Imperial Hotel Tokyo for 3 nights. Farewell drinks and get together this evening at a private function setting.

Reservation and payment To secure your place on a tour, a non-refundable deposit of \$1,000 is required at the time of reservation together with a signed and completed booking form and passport copy. An interim payment of \$4,000 is payable 90 days prior to departure. Final balance is payable by 52 days prior to departure unless otherwise specified. If your booking is made after 52 days prior to departure, then the full amount is payable at the time of booking.
